- 1. The provision is for expenditure of Secretariat of the Department of Drinking Water Supply.
- 2. The National Common Minimum Programme stipulates provision of drinking water for all rural habitations in the country. To this effect the Government has been progressively increasing the Annual Central Outlay for the Rural Water Supply Sector over the years. The 10th Plan objective envisages coverage of all rural habitations (including those which might have been slipped back from Fully Covered to Partially Covered/Not Covered Category) and quality affected ones. As of now more than 95% habitations are fully covered with drinking water supply with reference to Comprehensive Action Plan, 1999 and subsequent coverage position reported by States/UTs.

The two issues of sustainability and quality are being addressed by making efforts to promote sustainability and

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monitoring the water quality. Details of different models of rain water harvesting has been distributed to the States to generate more awareness about the same . A National Rural Water Quality Monitoring and Surveillance programme for institutionalising community based Water Quality Monitoring & Surveillance Systems has been finalised in consultation with the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.

- 3. The Government continues to give utmost importance for supplementing the efforts of the State Governments to provide sanitation facilities to the rural masses. Total Sanitation Campaign Projects have been launched in 452 districts. It is proposed to cover all the districts with Total Sanitation Campaign by the end of 10th Plan.
- 4. Lump sum provision has been kept for projects/ schemes for the benefit of North Eastern States including Sikkim.
