Industrial Sickness

- 47. Primary responsibility for tackling problems of industrial sickness is vested in the Board for Industrial and Financial Reconstruction(BIFR). Since its inception in May 1987, BIFR has received 3148 references till March 31, 1998. Over the period January 1997 to March 1998, the Board received 449 references. In the same period 294 cases were registered. Out of 215 references received from Central and State Public Sector Undertakings, 152 cases have been registered till 31st March, 1998. The Board has sanctioned rehabilitation schemes for 21 Central Public Sector Undertakings (CPSUs) and for 27 State Public Sector Undertakings (SPSUs). 10 CPSUs and 17 SPSUs have been recommended for winding up.
- 48. BIFR disposed of 220 cases between January 97 and March 1998. Table 7.14 gives the status relating to Private and Public Sector Undertakings registered with BIFR as on 31.3.1998.
- 49. The RBI has been guiding commercial banks in matters of early detection of sickness and rehabilitation of sick units on a priority basis. It has constituted a standing co-ordination committee for considering issues relating to co-ordination among banks, financial institutions and the State/Central Governments. A Bill was introduced in the Parliament during the last Budget Session to replace the Sick Industrial Companies(Special Provisions) Act, 1985. It aimed at improving efficiency in the functioning of the Board and speedy disposal of the cases before it.
