FCI's economic cost

5.36 Payment to growers at MSP is the first major cost of procurement incurred by the FCI, besides cost of transporting, handling, storing and distribution and maintaining the prescribed buffer stock. All these costs add up to the economic cost of the FCI. Economic cost incurred by FCI has been rising sharply in

recent years. This is largely on account of policy induced measures such an increase in MSP, open ended procurement and increase in the rates of state taxes and levies. This is a cause for concern, and if not checked, would exert an upward pressure on the already large food subsidy bill. (Table 5.10)
